

# **OVERVIEW OF TEXTILES SECTOR**

- Contributes to approx. 2% to India's GDP, 18.21% in Manufacturing sector (National Accounts Statistics 2018).
- The share of textile, apparel and handicrafts in India's total exports was 11.4% in 2020-21.
- India holds 4% share of the global trade in textiles and apparel.
- The textiles and apparel industry in India is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest employer in the country providing direct employment to 45 mn people and 100 mn people in allied industries.
- India's exports of textiles and apparel are expected to reach \$100 bn in the next 5 years, growing at a CAGR of 11%
- This industry alone has the capacity to generate around 70 jobs in garmenting and an average of 30 jobs overall for every INR 1 crore (USD 132,426) invested as compared to 12 jobs created on an average in other industries.



# Glimpse of Handlooms Heritage of Andhra Pradesh

**35 varieties of handloom products** are present in the state of Andhra Pradesh which comprise of Sarees, Fabrics, Shirting Fabric, Home furnishing Fabric, Bath Linen etc.

1,77,447 weavers **5% of India's** weavers are present in the State, with 482 working Primary Weavers Cooperative Societies.

6 handlooms GI Tagged from Andhra Pradesh namely, Mangalagiri Uppada Jamdani Fabric, Sarees. Dharmavaram Silk Sarees and Pavadas, Srikalahasti Kalamkari, Venkatagiri Sarees, Pedana Kalamkari.

# **Opportunities & Strengths - Existing Infrastructure**



**Availability of land** within Textile Parks with an option of Plug and Play Infrastructure - 2411 Ac (Private Parks-1180 Acres, Govt. Owned Parks-1231 Acres) in additional to the land available at APIIC Parks – 14,184 Acres.

**Inclusive and Holistic Development of the Industry** – Special support is being given for MSME Textile Units, realizing their potential to provide employment and compliment the large industries with value added services.





**Training and Skill Development Centres** – Identifying, mobilizing, training and supplying required manpower at Government owned Textile Parks. Presence of **NID, NIFT & IIHT** shall provide highly skilled manpower within the state.

**Walk to Work Concept** - Land is being identified for setting up of Garmenting units near Jagananna Housing Colonies in all 26 district of the state. Shall make the industry access to its biggest Raw material – man power within vicinity. 53 layouts with over 2000 plots.



# **Opportunities & Strengths - Scope of Future Investments**



As India **Going Green in Textiles** – Our state Formulating a conducive ecosystem for Textile Industry which encourages establishment of Environmental sustainable Textile Units.

**Mega Cluster Development -** planned to be fully integrated from Fibre to Final products, with all requisite support for industries to develop a plug-and-play model. Textile Parks like Brandix are envisioned for the future.





**Encourage Export Oriented units** – As of 2020-21, the Textile Exports for India stood at \$ 33.3 billion, of which, AP export share was \$ 417.2 million (1.2 % of total). In this view, the Government intends to expands its export market in Textiles and encourage units which are export oriented.

**Development of niche product segment** – Encourage sustainable fashion and cloth through cultivation of organic cotton, develop fabrics through handlooms i.e., mangalagiri handloom fabrics, pulagurtha fabrics, isukapalli fabrics for home furnishing, kalamkari handloom fabrics, kalamkari lace, dupion silk for home furnishing etc. A special emphasis is being laid on home textiles in this segment.



# Technical textiles, a sunrise Segment in Andhra Pradesh

As per the Baseline Study in 2020 on Technical Textiles Industry in by IIT Delhi Andhra Pradesh is 01 of 04 states which are attracting the maximum investments in Technical Textiles others are Gujarat, Maharashtra, and Telangana.

The state have **dedicated area** for Medical Textiles in Med Tech Zone at Vizag with all supporting facilities .















15 Technical Textiles companies present in Andhra Pradesh with Global Players like **Toray and Grasim**.
